TEACHING NIETZSCHE IN KUWAIT

After having lectured on Nietzsche in a philosophy course, the history professor in the novel *An Unlasting Home* is accused of blasphemy. While awaiting a possible death sentence, the professor reflects on her past and the women who shaped her.

Kuwaiti author **Mai Al-Nakib** emphasises women's feelings of unexpressed rage against their lack of autonomy in a patriarchal state like Kuwait. Mai Al-Nakib will meet the professor of history **Anne Katrine Bang** in a discussion about the grandmothers who inspired Al-Nakib when religion took precedence of law, and how a changing Kuwait affects the women who live there.
